Her research and publications have been in both clinical podiatric, orthopedic and educational arenas, and she has presented at multiple educational and clinical conference venues. Her current scholarship is focused on palliative and serious illness patient management training, telehealth/ telemedicine and interprofessional education. She is co-editor of a textbook by Oxford University Press entitled "Palliative Care Medicine for Physician Assistants: Fostering Resilience and Managing Seriously Ill Patients." Dr. Dimitrov received her BA from University of Colorado in liberal arts and psychology; earned a BS as a Physician Associate from Stony Brook University, and a Doctorate of Podiatric Medicine from the NY College of Podiatric Medicine.
