

The retreat will open with a poster session on Thursday, June 23, to highlight ongoing research within the division and to provide a networking opportunity to faculty and employees. Students, trainees and postdoctoral fellows will compete for best poster in three categories – Basic Science, Clinical Research, and Quality Improvement. A first, second and third prize will be given in each category.



On Friday, June 24, the Research Retreat Keynote Speaker will be Michel Sadelain, MD, PhD, Stephen and Barbara Friedman Chair, Director, Center for Cell Engineering, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, New York, New York.

There will be oral presentations from six Cyrus Scholar Awards finalists – three basic scientists and three clinical researchers. A panel of Distinguished Judges will select two winners, one in each category.



Michel Sadelain, MD, PhD, is the Director of the Center for Cell Engineering and the incumbent of the Stephen and Barbara Friedman Chair at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center. He is a Member of the Immunology Program and the Departments of Medicine and Pediatrics.

Dr. Sadelain's research focuses on human cell engineering and cell therapy to treat cancer and hereditary blood disorders. His laboratory has made several seminal contributions to the field of chimeric antigen receptors (CARs), from their conceptualization and optimization to their clinical translation for cancer immunotherapy. His group was the first to publish dramatic molecular remissions in patients with chemorefractory acute lymphoblastic leukemia following treatment with autologous CD19-targeted T cells.

Dr. Sadelain is the recipient of the Cancer Research Institute's Coley Award for Distinguished Research in Tumor Immunology, the Sultan Bin Khalifa International Award for Innovative Medical Research on Thalassemia, the NYPLA Inventor of the Year award, the Passano award, the Pasteur-Weizmann award, the Gabbay award, the INSERM International Prize Laureate, the Laureate of the 48th Foundation ARC Léopold Griffuel and most recently the Outstanding Achievement Award from the American Society of Gene and Cell Therapy. He previously served on the NIH Recombinant DNA Advisory Committee and as President of the American Society for Gene and Cell Therapy.

AWARDS COMPETITION

Michael and Mariet Cyrus have a long-standing tradition of philanthropy and community service. In 2005, they established the Cyrus Family Endowment to promote the development of basic and clinical research skills in internal medicine. With the support of the Cyrus family, matching gifts, and generous supporters, including faculty of the Division of Internal Medicine, the goal is to build the endowment to \$1 million. In addition, the awards are supplemented by unrestricted division funds and chair support.

The first Cyrus Scholar Awards in Outstanding Basic/
Translational Research and Outstanding Clinical
Research were given during the 2007 Research
Retreat. In 2009, the couple decided to name the
Outstanding Clinical Research Award in honor of
Michael's parents, James S. and Suzanne Cyrus.
During the first presentation of the award, Michael
Cyrus remarked, "It was with great respect, love and
honor that we established this award in the name of
our mother and father."

The endowment provides support for two competitive awards, each for \$15,000 (\$5,000 each year for three years) to an outstanding basic/translational researcher and a clinical researcher.
