The abstract and poster submissions will be peer-reviewed by the Section of Integrated Ethics at MD Anderson Cancer Center and IAEE 2021 scientific committee. They will be judged based on their quality.*

Oral Presentations

15-minute, real-time, presentations will be given via Zoom. Proposals for pre-recorded video submissions will be considered. Each breakout session, organized by theme, will have three presenters. Time will be allotted at the end of each session for questions. Themes might include but are not limited to: Genetics/Genomics, Artificial Intelligence, Solidarity and Collaboration, Moral Courage, Virtual Education, and more.

Abstract Formatting Instructions: Limit abstract body to 250 words, type in 12-point Times New Roman font, single spaced with one-inch margins, and left justified.

- Organize the abstract into: Introduction, Methods, Results, and Conclusions
- Include the abstract title, full names, and institutional affiliations of all authors, and e-mail address of the corresponding author at the top of the abstract
- Underline the name of the presenting author
- Abstracts must not contain copyrighted material unless permission has been obtained by the author/publisher
- Define all abbreviations
